Nomination Guidelines and Instructions

Members of Georgia's nonprofit health and healthcare community are invited to submit nominations for consideration. Organizations may nominate multiple candidates per category, and are encouraged to identify diverse candidates that consistently present themselves as role models and leaders in their communities. Submission Recommendations

(All levels of volunteer participation are strongly encouraged):

- Community/clinic health volunteers and leaders
- Health, patient, and marketplace navigators
- Community health workers, promoters/promotores, and Resource Mothers, etc.
- Nurses and other healthcare practitioners who volunteer their services
- Board members who go above and beyond the call of duty
- Nonprofit health organizations that exemplify collaborative approaches to improve the health and well-being of their community

Individual Award Nominations

Five individuals will be selected for the award. To be considered for the award, the following requirements *must be met*.

Individual nominees must:

- Be a volunteer or a previous volunteer for a health-related, nonprofit organization
- Have made a passionate commitment to improving the quality of health in a Georgia community
- Have unselfishly contributed their time to community activities
- Serve as a role model and inspiration to others



Individual Award Criteria

Please provide a response to **all items**.

1. What service does the nominee provide to the community for which they volunteer? Please include the population served and the approximate number of hours per month served by the volunteer in this capacity.
2. Has the volunteer ever been paid to fill this role? Refer only to the nominee's role as a volunteer.
3. As a volunteer, what impact do you believe this individual has had on the health of the community they serve?
4. What achievements, if any, can be cited as the direct result of this nominee's volunteer service to the community? Include specific, measurable outcomes, if applicable. (e.g. improved health services, increased access to care, or cost reductions)
5. Would you consider this nominee a role model or community leader? If so, why?
6. What motivated you to nominate this individual?

Collaborative Award Nominations

One community collaborative (comprised of three or more health-related Georgia nonprofit organizations) will be selected for this award. In order to be considered for this award, the following requirements *must be met*.

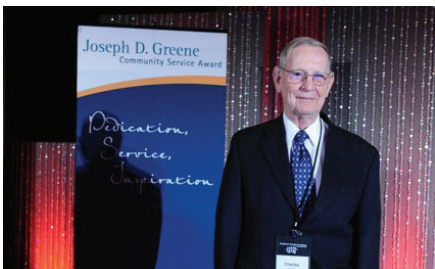
Collaborative nominees must:

- Be actively working together
- Represent partnership models working towards promising practices and results
- Show initiative and a deep commitment to addressing health-related needs of the community
- Demonstrate that the collaborative effort has been effective in improving the health of a Georgia community
- Reflect diversity in its membership

Collaborative Award Criteria

Please provide a response to **all items**.

1. Provide a detailed history and description of the collaborative effort. Include the collaborative's goals, objectives, partnerships, etc.
2. Describe the roles and responsibilities of the organizations involved in the collaborative.
3. What projects related to health and/or healthcare concerns does this collaborative address?
4. What impact has the collaborative had on the community? Be sure to include successes and specific results.
5. Does this collaborative reflect and represent the diversity of the community it serves?
6. Describe how the collaborative has been proactive in initiating change to promote better health outcomes in the community it serves.



The Nomination Process

Nominations must be submitted online, via direct mail, email or by fax. To submit your nomination online, visit www.healthcaregeorgia.org.

Nomination Forms are available for download at www.healthcaregeorgia.org, or by contacting the Foundation at **404-653-0990**. Be sure to include the following information:

1. Name, organization name(s), title (if applicable), address, telephone numbers and email address **of both the nominator and nominee(s)**
2. Answers to all Award Criteria requirements
3. Up to five pieces of supplemental information that illustrates the nominees' contributions to the community (news articles, pictures, brochures, etc.). (Optional)

All nomination materials submitted will become the property of Healthcare Georgia Foundation and will not be returned.

Award Selection Process

Nominations will be reviewed by an Award Selection Committee, a diverse group of Healthcare Georgia Foundation partners and grantees from various regions across the state. Award recipients will be required to submit a photograph, brief bio, be interviewed for a short video about their work in the community, sign a media release form, and attend the awards ceremony on April 22, 2014.

Recipients will be notified by the Foundation in February 2014.

Award Recognition and Ceremony

Recipients will be honored during a special ceremony at the InterContinental Buckhead Atlanta during **Connections 2014: Addressing Healthcare Access, Cost and Quality in Georgia**, Healthcare Georgia Foundation's Grantee and Partner Conference on the evening of April 22, 2014.

Healthcare Georgia Foundation will make a \$1,000 donation in the name of the recipient to a Georgia-based nonprofit health organization of their choice. Recipients will receive complimentary overnight accommodations during the evening of the ceremony.
